## Lead theft at Skipsea All Saints Church

In the early hours of 21st September, Mrs Warkup of Church Farm was disturbed by noises thought to be in their stack yard. On investigation a heap of lead was found by the roadside and a vehicle drove off swiftly.

The lead had formed a considerable part of the Church roof flashing and buttress cladding. Fortunately the main roof is stainless steel and was untouched.

Remedial work has now been completed, replacing the traditional lead with a lead substitute recently developed in Holland, which although durable has no scrap value.

Update on the internal building progress : tiling has started on the replacement floors and the wheelchair access ramp has been built.

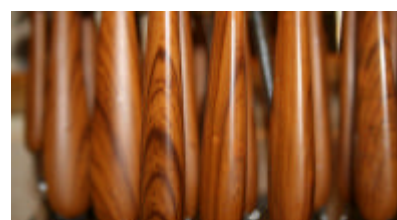
