## Yorkshire Film Archive Screening

Skipsea Village Hall (but to be shown at Ulrome Village Hall) will be screening **archive footage of East Yorkshire life** provided by the Yorkshire Film Archive. Yorkshire was the birthplace of moving image back in 1888 and the Yorkshire Film Archive is a treasure trove of film made in, or about Yorkshire— its job is to find, preserve and share our region's moving image heritage. ArtERY Co-ordinator, Ellen Thorpe said *“Showing film from the Yorkshire Film Archive has proved extremely popular so far. Last year in some village halls it was standing room only so we advise people to book in advance to guarantee a seat. Audiences will recognise many of the places featured in the film show, as we've asked the Archive to include lots of material from the East Riding. 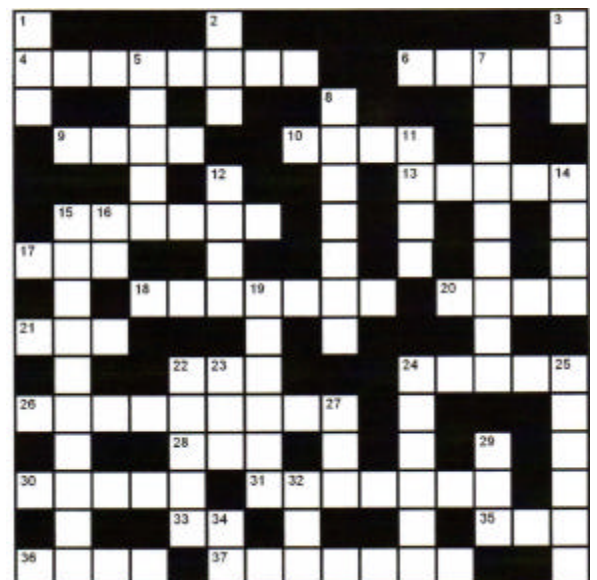

## KEEP SKIPSEA FREE OF DOG POO!

This is issue 29 of `The Mirror` and we are still having to remind a small minority of dog owners to clean up after their dogs, an extra bin was provided along Cliff Road at a substantial cost to the Parish Council, money that could have been spent elsewhere. I do not think there are any areas in the village that are free from dog poo but one or two areas are worse than others, Cliff Road and Cleeton Lane. This is an ongoing problem and a numbers of residents complained to the Parish Plan Committee in their survey in 2008, but it can only be resolved by ALL dog owners **BAGGING IT AND BINNING IT!** Bins can be provided but only if they will be used. It is now a fineable offence of £500 to allow your dog to foul anywhere in the village irrespective of whether the dog is on a lead or not.

Skipsea Parish Council are now taking this as a very serious matter to the extent that new signs will appear on the pavements and on the lamp posts and a dog warden has been asked to attend future council meetings.

**New Skipsea Community Centre Update**

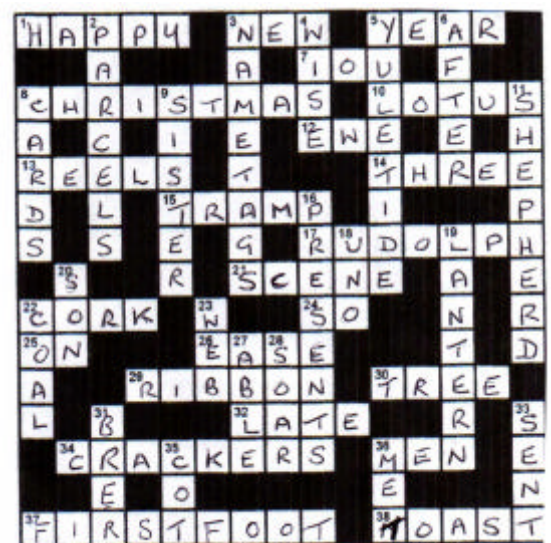
