HERE WE GO AT LAST CONSTRUCTION OF SKIPSEA'S NEW VILLAGE HALL HAS BEGUN

A muddy field on Bridlington Rd is being transformed into a wonderful new village hall for the residents of Skipsea. A number of people have put blood, sweat and tears into this project. There have been numerous problems along the way; many people had lost faith in it ever happening but many more had a strong belief that the New Village Hall would be constructed. 8am Monday morning 1st March, the footings are going in and members of the village hall committee are there to see it. When asked for their comments Julie Langley said "I am relieved and excited to be witnessing this event on such a beautiful morning". Margaret Hughes said "she was thrilled that the village hall building had begun". Jerry Loft the chairman of the committee said "today is a big occasion for Skipsea, on a par with the building of Skipsea School". Brian Fell, the main building contractor, said the weather had caused a number of problems but today was a good day.

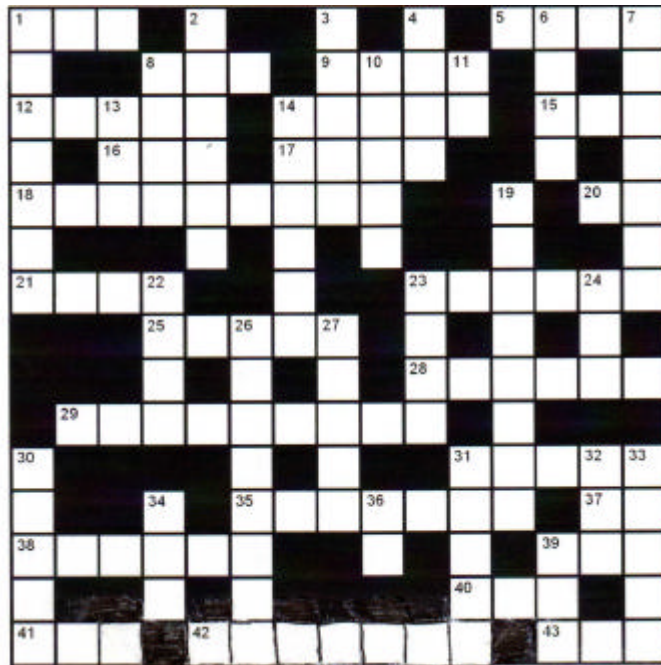
