SKIPSEA READING ROOM

When the new Village Hall is ready the Skipsea Parish Council will be moving there for meetings, etc. and will cease funding the Reading Room. This will leave the building with little or no income, making the Trustees liable personally for any costs, etc.– which they are not prepared to take on board.

To this end the Trustees have decided to consider selling the property. In the meantime they are applying for planning permission for a change of use to a domestic dwelling, as all advice received indicates this would realise the best price, if the building was sold. The exterior of the building will remain virtually as it is.

If anyone wishes to come forward with a viable proposition for running the Reading Room (including maintenance), for the Trustees to consider, they should do so by September 1st 2010.

If the Reading Rooms were to be sold the proceeds will be available to groups and residents of Skipsea., subject to meeting criteria laid down by the Charity Commission and approval of the Trustees.

None of the proceeds would be going to the build of the new Village Hall.

We trust that all residents of Skipsea will give this matter their maximum consideration and that a viable solution be found, either to save the Reading Room in its present form, or for the building to become a private dwelling, maximising its value to the community.

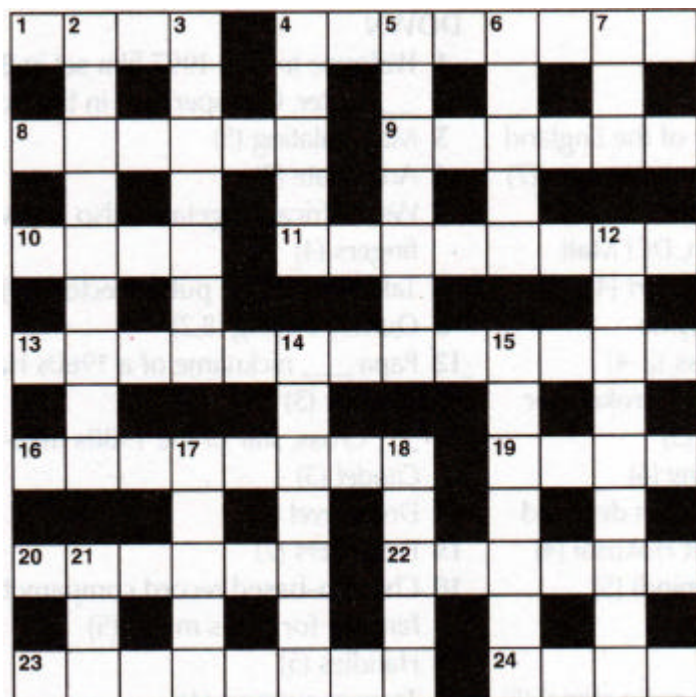

Weeders Digest : Blooming June

Harvest strawberries and start harvesting early potatoes.
 Sow runner beans into rich ground at the base of tall supports.
 Plant out tomatoes, cucumber and squash, hardening plants off first.
 Cut down any remaining spring flowering bulb foliage.
 Cut back old leaves and flower stalks of hellebores.
 Dead head camellias and rhododendrons to increase buds for next year's flowers.
 Mow lawns regularly; leave the grass longer in hot, dry periods.
