Gurkha Charity Evening

The long anticipated Gurkha Charity Evening organized jointly by Cpt. Baldeep Tamang of Leconfield and Ian Banks took place in the Village Hall on Saturday 19th February. 140 guests from as far a field as London and Cumbria were treated to a hot Nepalese buffet of rice, pork curry, chicken curry, mixed vegetables, lentil sauce and chutneys, all prepared and efficiently served by the Leconfield Gurkhas, under the direction of Sgt Bhakta Gurung, ably assisted by Cpl. Nagendra Limbu and Cpl. Bhim.

Over tea and coffee the guests heard more about the two charities; Ian Banks spoke about the Yorkshire Yak Health Post project to build a Health Centre in the remote Himalayan village of Chuplung he then introduced Sgt. Gerung who spoke about the work of the Gurkha Welfare Trust which not only supports former Gurkhas and their widows but also helps needy communities in Nepal by supplying piped water, building bridges and carrying out other important projects.

Entertainment was then provided by 12 new Gurkha recruits who had been trained by Cpl. Sitaram Rai. The trainees, aged about 20 only arrived at Leconfield in January where they are taught to drive a range of army vehicles, their performance included the famous Gurkha Khukuri dance, other traditional dancing and singing and a modern song and dance.

The evening raised £1,262 which will be divided equally between the two charities. In addition a collection at the end of the evening raised an extra £344.30 for the Gurkha Welfare Trust, meaning that the total raised on the evening was £1,606.30. To date, this was the biggest sit down meal in the new village hall with 116 in the main hall and a further 20 people in the seminar room. Thanks to all who helped in any way to make the evening such a success and to those who attended. So popular was the event, that a waiting list has been started for the repeat event, this will take place in the Village Hall on Saturday 26th March at 7.30pm. Tickets (£10) are on sale at the Post Office, alternatively call 01262 468237.
