 1/2 cup vegetable oil
 2 oz raisins
 3 eggs beaten
 2 dessert apples

Mix all the ingredients together. Peel, core and finely slice apples and add to the mixture. Divide between 2 x 7" square prepared tins. Bake at 150C, 300F or gas mark 3 for about 1 hour 15 mins.

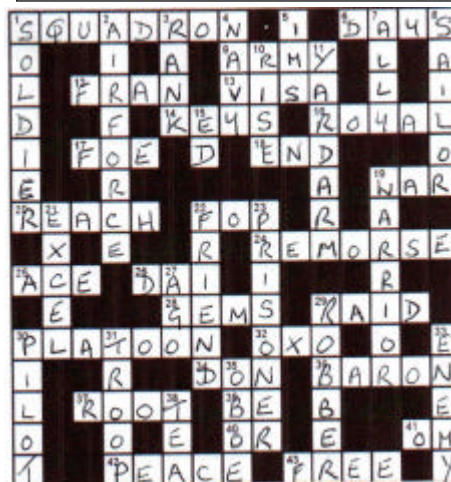

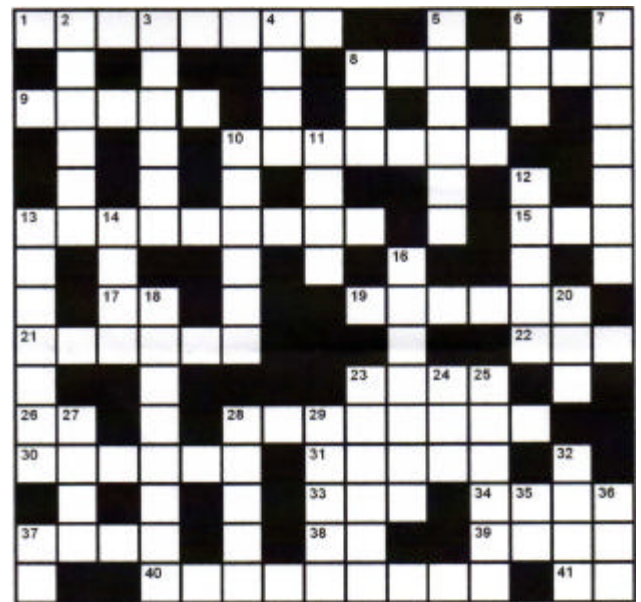

Interested in saving money on central heating oil?

Domestic heating costs are higher than they have ever been and seem set to rise again. If you use oil to heat your home as many of us in Skipsea do, you could save at least 10% a year on your heating bills by getting together to form an oil club with other users in the village. Oil clubs negotiate with oil suppliers to find the best price on offer. When the price is agreed a single delivery date is decided. The club saves money because it places a bulk order and the supplier only has to make one trip to the area. This makes it better for the environment to. One community group in Oxfordshire, the Oxfordshire Rural Community Council, set up its own oil club to help support the rural community. Members are reported as saving about 10p per litre in this bulk buying scheme.
