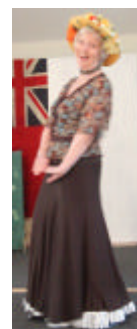
The King comes to Skipsea!

Henry V, Mad Carew, Flanagan & Allan and a host of other Musical Hall characters came to Skipsea Village Hall on Saturday, May 5th. It was the day of Skipsea's first Music Hall entertainment. What a day!!

After the morning brunch was cleared away the hall was transformed into the magical world of theatre. The `Skipsea Players`, plus some welcome recruits from the Skipsea Choir, began to arrive to have their hair and make up sorted by Ellie and Jo; then it was a last-minute dash to the loo before donning costumes and wigs, then into the dressing rooms to await the arrival of the audience. Malcolm Sparks, our producer, resplendent in his white scarf and top hat, oversaw the last-minute technical details, our pianist, Sue Finn, (who was only recruited at the last minute) took her seat.

The lights went down, fluttering butterflies dispersed and the magic began. The whole company opened the show with a burst of summertime songs, then there were tales of love and revenge about a one-eyed god, a child-eating lion and a crazy adventure on the high seas. After a much welcome cup of tea, the adventure continued. Marie sang two more nostalgic songs and a group of the junior players showed off their dancing skills. Anyone coming would you kindly donate a prize for the tombola.

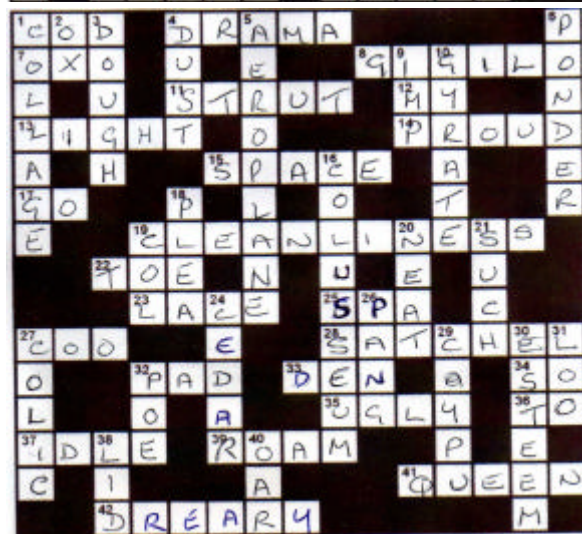
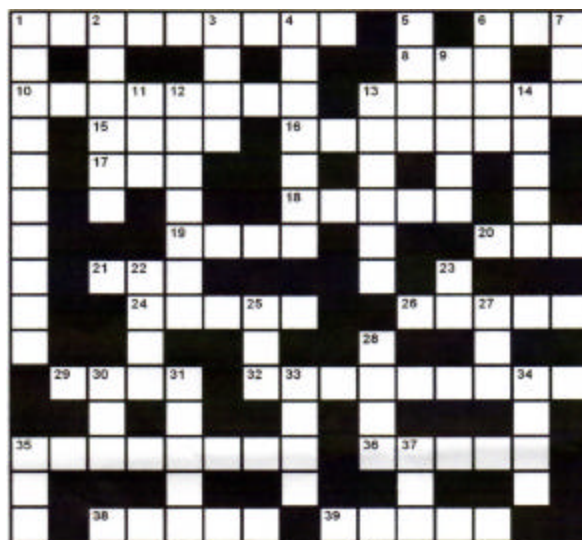
