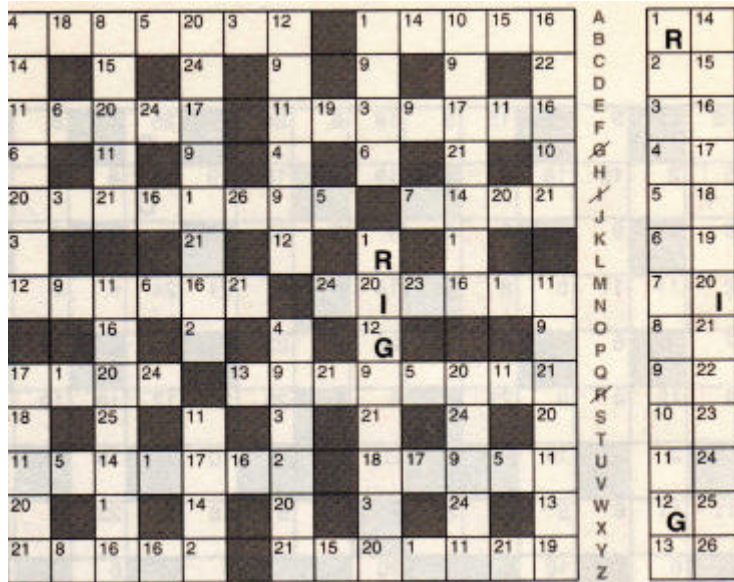

BAG IT AND BIN IT

The East riding of Yorkshire Council's dog warden service is undertaking a campaign to promote responsible dog ownership. Responsible dog ownership covers a variety of issues including dog welfare and preventing your dog from straying, but probably of most concern is dog fouling. There is a dog control order in force that makes it an offence to fail to clean up after your dog has fouled a place to which the public have access. The dog wardens will be visiting your area to enforce this order and issue fixed penalty notices to offenders (£75). If you have any information that will allow us to challenge dog owners who fail to clean up after their dog or deposit bagged dog muck as litter please let us know, by reporting them on 01482 396301 or by e-mail to pests.dogs@eastriding.gov.uk Nobody likes to stand in dog muck so please be a responsible dog owner and clean it up-remember it may be you who stands in it.
