Would you like cheaper electricity through bulk buying? Register with YORSwitch for a free no obligation quote. What is it? YORSwitch is a government funded scheme to make it easier for consumers to switch power supply companies. (in order to get the best price) run by East Riding Council

How does it work? Residents register to take part through the website at www.eastriding.gov.uk/yorswitch calling in at a Customer Services Centre with a copy of your electricity bill or telephoning 01482 393939. The council will hold an auction between power companies for the best price, participants will be sent details and can decided whether it is worth switching or not. You can register anytime until 8th April. The auction will take place on 9th.
