### **Preparing for icy blasts**

East Riding of Yorkshire Council has been getting ready to do battle against snowdrifts and ice. Essential machinery has been serviced, ready for action to keep the local roads moving in spite of bad weather. The 60-strong team of gritter drivers have completed their training and are carrying out test runs. Salt bins are being checked and re-filled where necessary, with a total of a1000 bins and 400 salt heaps, it takes time to service them all.

The councils winter team provides the winter service, which is a year-round operation. The precautionary network covers 38 per cent of all roads in the area, the secondary network covers a further 12 per cent.
