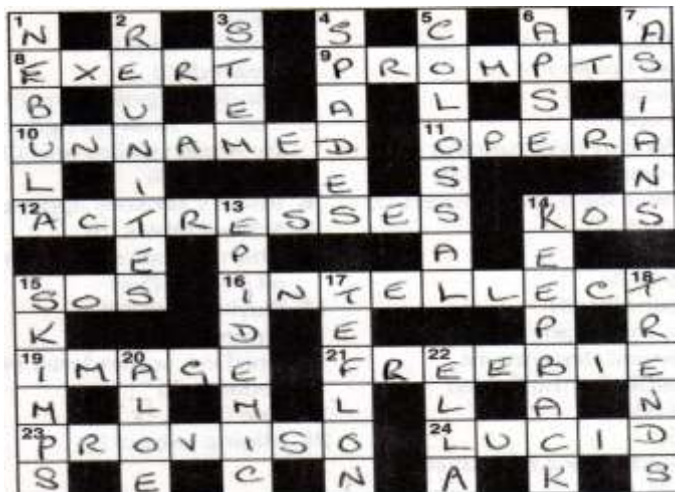

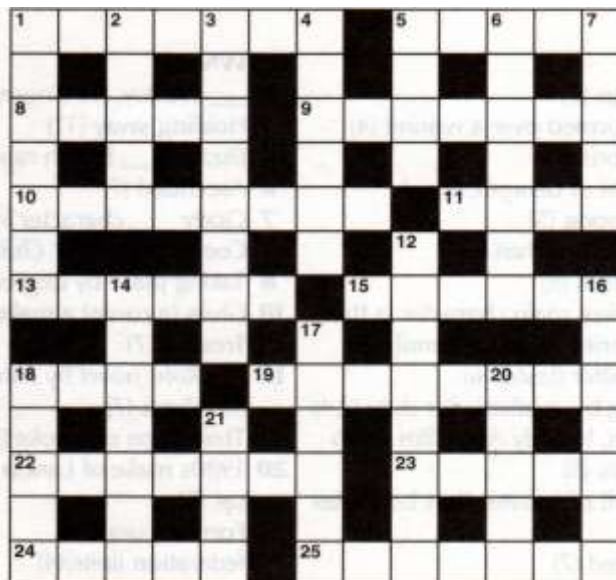

### Defibrillator for Skipsea

Skipsea Parish Council has been successful in applying to ERYC local grant fund for funding a Community Public Access Defibrillator a cabinet and training for local people on how to use it. The machine will be installed outside the post office. Funding has also been raised by the excellent work of Skipsea youngsters Bonnie Marfitt, Libby Douglas, Maisie Smith and Ben Bailey taking part in Humberside Police`s Operation Life-style last summer. They raised £200 which will be used to maintain the equipment over the next few years– the average cost is £50.

A familiarization session to learn more about the defibrillator will be provided by Trish Kilner Yorkshire Ambulance service on Monday 22nd February 7pm at the village hall
